General information

On 30 November 2016, the European Commission presented a package of measures aimed at preserving the European Union's competitiveness in a transition to clean energy that changes the image of global energy markets

- 1. Directive on the promotion of the use of energy from renewable sources
- 2. Directive on the energy efficiency
- 3. Directive on the energy performance of buildings
- 4. Regulation on the Governance of the Energy Union
- 5. Directive on common rules for the internal market in electricity
 - 6. Regulation on the internal market for electricity
 - 7. Regulation on risk preparedness in the electricity sector
 - 8. Regulation of establishing a European Union Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators

- Ensuring fair prices for consumers
- > Ensure a stable legislative framework to facilitate the transition to clean energy
- Achieving a more stable, more competitive and more sustainable energy sector in the EU
- > De-carbonization of the electricity market renewable energy as a major part of the electricity market
- Market incentives for investment in flexible resources
- Electricity prices to be determined through demand and supply


Goals

❖ Directive on the energy performance of buildings



Goals

- Improving the energy efficiency in buildings
- Promoting the renovation of buildings
- Decarbonisation of the existing, highly inefficient European building stock
- Promoting cost-effective repairs
- Introduction of Smart Build Indicator
- Simplification of the inspections of heating and air conditioning systems
- Promotion of electromobility by creating parking spaces for electric vehicles

June 2017 – General Approach on Council of Ministers

Proposal on REGULATION of the European Parliament and of the Council on the Governance of the Energy Union



Goals

- Mechanism for MS 'collective achievement of the goals of the Energy Union
- Implementation of the EU commitments under the Paris Agreement


❖ Proposal on DIRECTIVE of the European Parliament and of the Council on common rules for the internal market in electricity



Goals

- Active users
- A well-functioning internal market
- > Balanced decision on the application of regulated prices
- > Regulatory framework on energy communities
- > Determining the roles and responsibilities of market participants





❖ Proposal for a REGULATION of the European Parliament and of the council on the internal market for electricity



Goals

- Bidding zones configuration
- Removes existing barriers to cross-border trade
- Removal of administrative and implicit price caps
- Removal of capacity mechanisms
- Strengthen the Regional cooperation of transmission system operators
- ➤ EU DSO entity should be established in order to raise efficiencies in the electricity distribution networks in the Union and ensure close cooperation with TSOs and ENTSO-E
- ➤ The Commission has the power to adopt and amend implementing acts which are fundamental for market integration until 31.12.2025








Goals

- Establishing common rules for the prevention and management of crises in the electricity sector
- Regional Interdependencies center of national risk and crisis situation plans
- Market-based co-operation in risk situation
- Transparent reimbursement measures in the event of market disruption

- Coordination of cross border trade and security
- ➤ Development of terms and conditions or methodologies (TCM) for the implementation of network codes and guidelines (NC & GL)
